WEEK C - O30 LUKE 18: 9-14

Jesus' Parable of Two Men Praying in the Temple

Jesus addressed this parable to those who were convinced of their own righteousness and despised everyone else. "Two people went up to the temple area to pray; one was a **Phanisee** and the other was a tax collector.

The Pharisee took up his position and spoke this prayer to himself, 'O God, I thank you that I am not like the rest of humanity -- greedy, dishonest adulterous -- or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week, and I pay tithes on my whole income. But the tax collector stood off at a distance and would not even raise his eyes to heaven but beat his breast and prayed,



'O God, be merciful to me a sinner." I tell you, the latter went home justified, not the former; for everyone who **exalts** himself will be **humbled**, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted."
